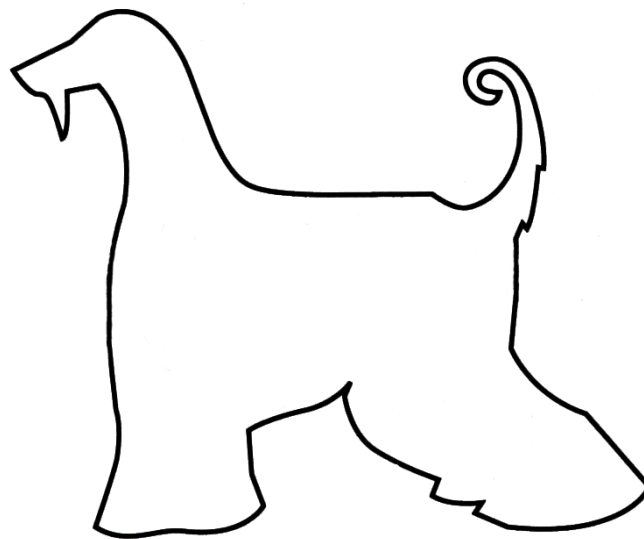

JUDGES' CRITERIA

C List – Junior

For persons who the MAHC would support to judge the breed up to a maximum of 3 classes (4 classes if one is a Puppy class) at Open Show level.

BREED SPECIALIST & NON BREED SPECIALIST

For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of the Midland Afghan Hound Club.

Even if the above criteria are met, this does not mean automatic inclusion onto the above Judging Lists, as this is at the discretion of the Judges' Sub Committee.

B List - Intermediate

For persons who the MAHC would support to judge the breed at all levels without Challenge Certificates.

BREED SPECIALIST

Requirements include:

- a) To have 5 years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed and have the support of the MAHC.
- b) To have judged 10 classes of this breed at Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs.
- c) To have judged 24 dogs of this breed.
- d) To have attended at least 1 breed specific judging seminar with hands-on training session or a Breed Appreciation Day.
- e) To have passed an exam for breed Judges organised by the MAHC, or any other Afghan Hound Breed Club or passed a Multiple Choice Breed Standard Exam.
- f) To have stewarded any breed over a minimum of 6 days at shows.

B LIST - NON BREED SPECIALIST

Requirements include:

- a) To have a minimum of 5 years judging experience in any one breed and have the support of the MAHC.
- b) To award CCs in one other breed.
- c) To have judged 10 classes of this breed at Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs (save in exceptional circumstances).
- d) To have judged 24 dogs of this breed.
- e) To have attended 1 breed specific seminar with a hands-on training session or a Breed Appreciation Day.
- f) To have passed an exam for breed Judges organised by the MAHC, or any other Afghan Hound Breed Club or passed a Multiple Choice Breed Standard exam.

Even if the above criteria are met, this does not mean automatic inclusion onto the above Judging Lists, as this is at the discretion of the Judges' Sub Committee.

A1 List

For persons who have previously been approved by the KC to award CCs in the breed and have completed their first appointment. To have the support of the MAHC. **KC Policy**

A2 List

For persons who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with KC requirements and accepted by the KC for inclusion on an A2 list and have the support of the MAHC

A3 List

For persons who the MAHC would support to judge the breed who fulfil all the requirements of the A3 list but who have not yet been assessed in accordance with KC requirements and have not yet been accepted by the KC for inclusion on an A2 List.

BREED SPECIALIST

Requirements include:

- a) To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed and been active and have the support of the MAHC.
- b) To have judged a Breed Club Open Show with not less than 10 classes.
- c) To have judged a minimum of 34 classes.
- d) To have judged a minimum of 120 dogs.
- e) To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer, and passed the relevant examination on KC Regulations and Judging Procedures.
- f) To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement.
- g) To have attended and passed a Points of the Dog Assessment conducted a KC Accredited Trainer
- h) To have attended a breed specific judging seminar with a hands-on training session or a Breed Appreciation Day.
- i) To have passed an exam for breed Judges organised by the MAHC or any other Afghan Hound Breed Club or passed a KC Breed Competence Assessment.
- j) To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs when they obtained their first entry in the KC Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
- k) To have stewarded over a minimum of 12 days at shows (Open or Championship shows only).

NON BREED SPECIALIST

Requirements include:

- a) To have a minimum of 5 years judging experience in any one breed (to include 5 years in this breed) and have the support of the MAHC.
- b) To have judged a Breed Club Open Show with not less than 10 classes.
- c) To have judged a minimum of 34 classes of this breed.
- d) To have judged 120 dogs of this breed.
- e) To have awarded CCs in at least one other breed.

- f) To have attended a breed specific judging seminar with a hands-on training session or a Breed Appreciation Day.
- g) To have passed an exam organised by the MAHC or any other Afghan Hound Breed Club or passed a KC Breed Competence Assessment.
- h) To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs of any breed when they obtained their first entry in the KC Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).

Even if the above criteria are met, this does not mean automatic inclusion onto the above Judging List, as this is at the discretion of the Judges' Sub Committee.

Overseas Judges

An overseas Judge must have completed a minimum period of 7 years judging at CC level or equivalent, including 5 years for Afghan Hounds and have the support of the MAHC.
